Charles P. Rubenstein has an earned doctorate in bioengineering from the Polytechnic Institute of New York and a Masters in library and information science from Pratt Institute, both in Brooklyn, NY.

Dr. Rubenstein is professor of engineering and information science at Pratt Institute's graduate School of Information and Library Science and a visiting professor in the Institute for Research and Technology Transfer (IRTT) at Farmingdale State College (SUNY).

A senior member of the IEEE, he has served on the IEEE-USA Board as Technical Activities Representative (currently IEEE-USA liaison to the IEEE Conferences Committee); on the IEEE Publication Services and Products Board; the IEEE Engineering Management Society Board (Vice President for Member Relations and currently Vice President for Conferences); and the Region 1 Board (Area Chair, Electronic Communications Coordinator, and currently Conferences Coordinator). A frequent presenter of Leadership and Podcasting Workshops, Web Design, Wireless Technologies seminars all over the United States, his 'Scalability of IEEE Membership' presentation has been well received at S-PACs, and Student/GOLD Congresses worldwide.

He has received many IEEE honors including the IEEE-USA Robert S. Walleigh Distinguished Professionalism Award, Regional Activities Board Innovation Award, Centennial Outstanding Young Engineer Award and IEEE Third Millennium Medal, and was elected an Honorary Life Member of the IEEE Engineering Management Society.
